

PSYCHOLOGICAL SUSPENSE

As the name states, psychological suspense novels are especially concerned with the psychological undertones of the crime. In some books of this genre, the focus is on the mind of disturbing villains, while in others, the setting is more domestic, and the emphasis is on the psychological dynamics at play between the characters. These books are usually highly atmospheric and often have a slower pace and more elegant writing styles than other suspense novels.
